

# EXPLORE THE PRISON

**1 VIEWING DECK** This site overlooks the Colorado River, Yuma Crossing's granite outcroppings, the Quechan Indian Nation, St. Thomas Mission, and the Union Pacific railroad and Ocean-to-Ocean bridges.

**2 GIFT SHOP/ADMISSION** Browse our gift shop for Old West books, souvenirs, and museum swag while you grab a cool refreshment. It's also where you'll purchase admission and start your museum adventure.

**3 GUARD TOWER** With a commanding view of the grounds and built atop the prison's original water supply, this reconstructed tower represents one of the many that once watched over inmates and prevented escapes. To the east lie the restored Yuma East Wetlands.

**4 SALLY PORT** One of the last original adobe structures from the 1876 Yuma Territorial Prison, this building served as the checkpoint for all who entered or left the prison.

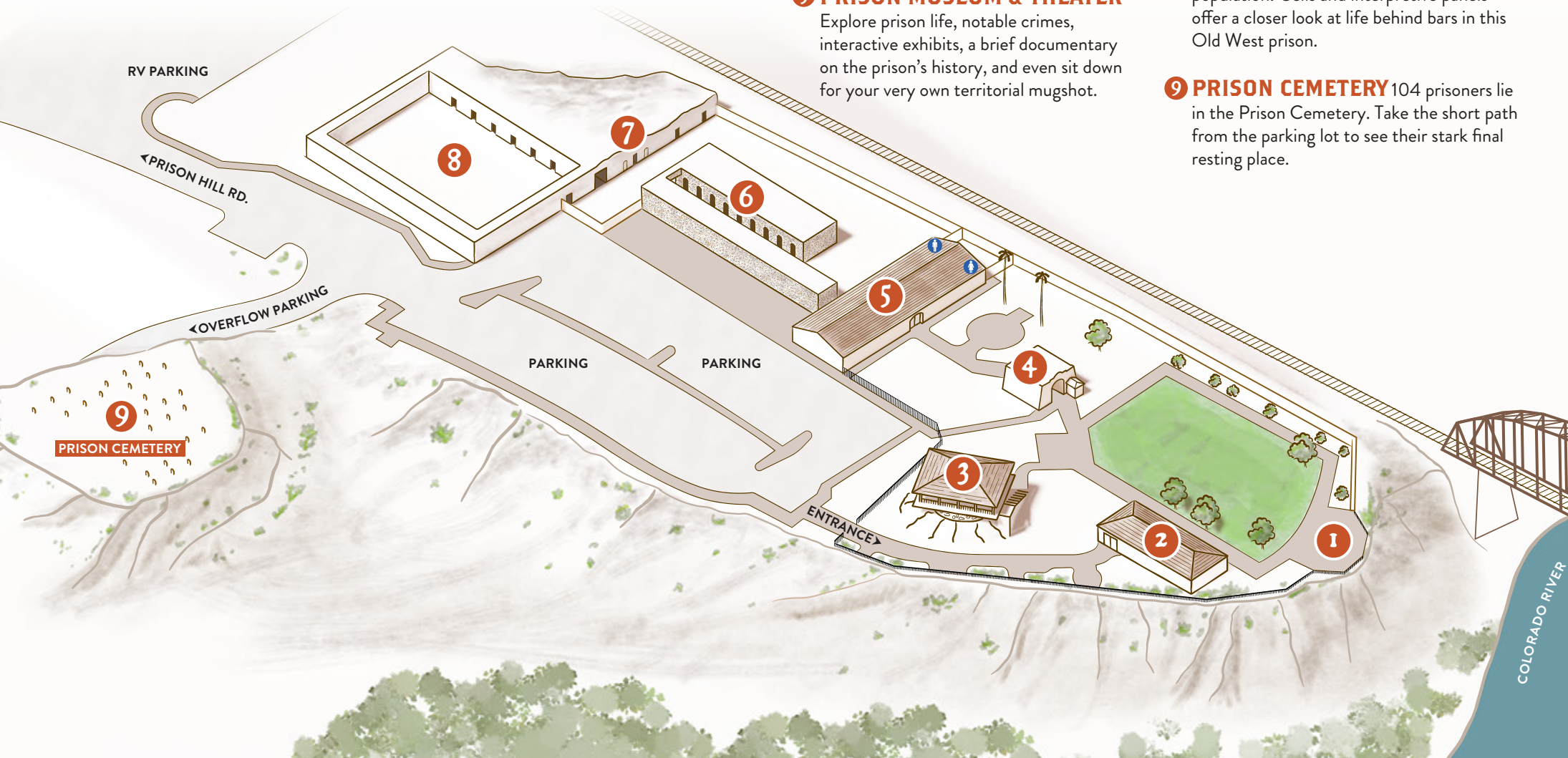
**5 PRISON MUSEUM & THEATER** Explore prison life, notable crimes, interactive exhibits, a brief documentary on the prison's history, and even sit down for your very own territorial mugshot.

**6 CELL BLOCK** The cell block offers a vivid glimpse of prison life, with six inmates per cell! Step inside the actual cells and capture photo-worthy keepsakes.

**7 DARK CELL & MORE** Step into the infamous Dark Cell, where the hardest prisoners were sent—some driven to madness and placed in the Insane Cell. Explore the Barbershop, Infirmary, and Women's Cell Block, too.

**8 NEW YARD** The new yard was built to accommodate the growing prison population. Cells and interpretive panels offer a closer look at life behind bars in this Old West prison.

**9 PRISON CEMETERY** 104 prisoners lie in the Prison Cemetery. Take the short path from the parking lot to see their stark final resting place.
